PROJECT TOGETHER: BRIEF FOR INTERNAL INTERVIEWS

INTRODUCTION

The Green Party is in the process of developing a breakthrough strategy for the next 10 years that will pinpoint the most impactful way The Green Party can make living a greener life, in a green economy, the norm in Britain. We will use this to shape how the party raises funds and put those funds to work to drive the breakthrough communications plan and electoral success and social change that will follow. We're setting out to build a political party fit for 21st century green purpose.

We've called this process 'Project Together' because we believe this will only be successful if we're all involved and supportive of it. We're therefore running a comprehensive process that involves talking to the regions, the liberation groups, as well as external experts in the environment, politics and wider sectors.

Initial interviews with external experts have framed the significant moment we are facing and the clear opportunity for The Green Party to provide both leadership and a critical role within a potential 're-set' scenario.

We want to complement the external interviews with internal perspectives on similar questions, particularly to identify how we can build on our strengths at a regional and local level.

OBJECTIVES FOR THE INTERNAL INTERVIEWS

For the Green Party to look inside itself and gather the perspectives of a broad range of individuals to explore perceptions of where the Green Party is now and how it could have a stronger influence and impact in the next 5-10 years Specifically:

- To involve and engage everyone to ensure they are part of this process
- To explore what they and their regions feel is important in future development
- To look for bright spots things that are working that we can build on
- To ask people to identify what they see as their role in realising the future potential of the Green Party
